## **Biostatistics Consultation Service Launched**



Ramsay Hospital Research Foundation has launched a new biostatistical consultation service for any Ramsay accredited practitioner or staff to assist with research activities.

Our biostatistician, Nazim Bhimani, works in medical research as a Biostatistician and Data Manager for the Gastrointestinal Department at Royal North Shore Hospital, Sydney, is a lecturer in Surgical Education at the University of Sydney and is undertaking a part time PhD in Medicine

from the University of Sydney.

The consultation may cover the feasibility of your project proposal, clarification of research questions and the identification of outcomes, management of confounding variables, sample size requirements/ power analysis, practicality of data collection, assistance conducting analyses and the interpretation of results.

An initial one-hour consultation is free of charge until October this year.

The Avenue Private Hospital and John Flynn Private Hospital have recently completed the <u>SPARK study</u>, a Phase 2B trial assessing pain relief after total knee replacement. The trial

marks a significant milestone in evaluating new treatment approaches, thanks to investigators **Dr. Andrew Shimmin** (The Avenue Private Hospital) and **Dr. David Liu** (John Flynn Private Hospital) along with the collaborative efforts of the broader research team and participants.

# Collaborative Research Request (CRR)

To foster a culture of cross-system collaboration, RHRF will consider requests to financially support and be involved in collaborative research projects.

These may include applications for; National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) grants; Medical Research Future Fund (MRFF) grants; Australian Research Council (ARC) grants; Cooperative Research Centres (CRC) grants, or other

# Social Determinants of Health (SDH) Innovation Grant

RHRF is seeking to develop a sustainable approach to addressing social determinants of health (SDH) in partnership with other healthcare and community organisations.

To align with the broader mission of RHRF this grant round will focus on health issues that affect the following population cohorts;

- Women
- Regional & Rural population

A maximum of **\$400,000** is available for contribution per project, for projects of duration up to five (5) years, on the condition that RHRF is not the only participant to provide cash support.

People aged over 60.

A maximum of **\$800,000** is available per project, for projects up to a maximum of three (3) years in duration. The RHRF Board will fund up to four projects that best align with the strategic priorities of the foundation.
