Targeted Training Modules

We are developing training focused on enhancing staff proficiency in clinical trial management including understanding staff roles, ethics and governance processes, research protocols and site management across different phases of a clinical trial.

Increased Staffing Capabilities

We are upskilling our existing staff, creating a workforce development pipeline to develop careers in clinical trials, and broadening our capabilities (e.g. biostatistical support).

We will continue to strive to support clinical trials through bettering our infrastructure, resources, funding opportunities and research activities where possible.

Highlights from some of our CTN sites

Explore some of the latest milestones and achievements from a few of our clinical trial sites across Australia

Will soon start recruiting for <u>The MIND Study</u>, which is looking into biomarkers in Neuropsychiatric Disorders. This is a Ramsay Hospital Research Foundation funded study that is run in collaboration with University of Melbourne, and could lead to a more precise and targeted treatment for dementia.

Peninsula Private Hospital, NSW

First site globally to open the haematology trial looking into the safety, tolerability and recommended dose of a new drug in patients with relapsed/ refractory B-Cell Non-Hodgkin Lymphoma.

Joondalup Health Campus, WA

First Australian site to have SIV for a Pediatric study, evaluating the efficacy, safety and drug levels of oral Ozanimod in participants with moderately to severely active Crohn's disease with an inadequate response to conventional therapy.

Pindara Private Hospital, QLD

Highest recruiting site globally for a trial looking at the effects of the combination of Elranatamab, Daratumumab, and Lenalidomide compared with Daratumumab, Lenalidomide, and Dexamethasone in patients with newly diagnosed Multiple Myeloma who are not candidates for transplant.

Highest recruiting site globally for a study evaluating the safety, tolerability and effectiveness of Tinodasertib in combination with Pembrolizumab or Irinotecan in metastatic colorectal cancer.

Shout Outs...

Congratulations to Wollongong Private Hospital Clinical Trials Unit (CTU) on recruiting the first Australian patient for a haematology trial for non-Hodgkin's lymphoma. This was the first patient in Australia and the third patient globally.

Additionally, the recruitment and dosing of the first NSW patient and third patient globally into a complex phase 1 leukaemia trial.

These were two significant milestones for Wollongong Private Hospital's clinical trials unit, after an effort to intentionally expand into the specialty.

John Flynn Private Hospital announces it's first Cardiology clinical trial to be conducted on site as they expand their clinical trials unit into this therapeutic area.

This study aims to evaluate the efficacy and safety of a new method to treat patients with heart failure and left ventricular ejection failure.

The clinical trials team at John Flynn Private Hospital have been working closely with Boehringer Ingelheim and IQVIA, the study sponsors, to get this important trial up and running.

It represents a step forward in cardiovascular research and a significant opportunity to improve patient care.

Recent publications in the **New England Journal of Medicine (NEJM)**. NEJM is the most widely read, cited and influential general medical journal globally, and highlights the exceptional impact of these publications.

A huge congratulations to **Dr Hanlon Sia and Pindara Private Hospital Clinical Trials & Research Unit** on their involvement in and publication of the DREAMM-7 and DREAMM-8 Trials. These pivotal studies evaluated the efficacy and safety of alternative treatments for patients with relapsed or refractory multiple myeloma. The results demonstrate significant improvement in patient outcomes, supporting the potential for robust new treatment options. View the DREAMM-7 publication here and the DREAMM-8 publication here.

Dr Andrew van der Westhuizen and Lake Macquarie Private Hospital Clinical Trials & Research Unit were involved in



conducting the NADINA trial, a revolutionary trial that tested the effectiveness of a new melanoma treatment. This involves combination immunotherapy given before, rather than after, surgery for patients with resectable, macroscopic stage III melanoma. Interim analysis showed overwhelmingly positive results, with an 83.7% event free survival rate at 12 months in those who received treatment before surgery, compared to 57.2% in the group who received treatment after surgery.
