Site Spotlights

Sunshine Coast University Private Hospital (SCUPH) Approved for their first ever trial in rheumatology

A huge milestone achieved for SCUPH as they expand their clinical trials capabilities into a new therapeutic area. Having previously only conducted trials in oncology, SCUPH, under the guidance of Renae Jackson (Clinical Trials and Research Unit Manager), have been approved for their first trial specialising in Rheumatology.

Dr. Sue Thackwray leads the studies implementation at SCUPH. The study aims to evaluate the efficacy and safety of a topical gel treatment for Chronic Plaque Psoriasis.

This week, the study team recruited their first patient to the trial.

Lake Macquarie Private Hospital

First Australian site to be activated for the CAMBRIA-2 Breast Cancer Trial

Lake Macquarie Private Hospital Clinical Trials and Research Unit, managed by Hollie Ritchie is the first Australian site to be activated for the CAMBRIA-2 Clinical Trial. The study is also due to be run at **Southern Highlands Private Hospital**. The site has been approved and is awaiting activation.

CAMBRIA-2 is for men or women who have ER-positive, HER2-negative early breast cancer that has an intermediate or high risk of recurrence. The study aims to recruit 5,500 patients at approximately 700 sites across 40 countries.

The treatment being trialled is a type of endocrine treatment called a 'selective oestrogen receptor degrader' (SERD). The SERD works by breaking down the oestrogen receptors in cells, and also blocks the oestrogen receptors from being triggered by oestrogen. This prevents ER-positive cancer cells receiving messages to grow and multiply and may help to reduce the chance of cancer coming back.

Open Grant Rounds

Ramsay Hospital Research Foundation currently has two grant rounds open.

Translational Challenge Grant (TCG)

TCG is RHRF's most prominent grant stream that specifically seeks to fund translational research projects that will break the cycle of disadvantage and improve patient outcomes.

A maximum of \$400,000 is available per project, for projects of duration up to three years.




