Ramsay & Rotary Berrima Medical Equipment Donation Program

Ramsay Health Care's corporate social responsibility program is making a difference through a partnership with the Rotary Club of Berrima District and its project, Medical Aid for Oceania and Worldwide (MAFO).

The partnership aims to establish an efficient and effective program for distributing medical equipment and goods to needy communities in Australia and overseas.

The partnership came out of Ramsay's and Rotary's joint desire to establish a mechanism for the responsible donation and reuse of hospital and medical equipment and supplies which are no longer required by Ramsay Health Care's hospitals. Under the partnership, Ramsay Health Care identifies suitable items for potential donation, while MAFO organises a suitable recipient and manages the delivery logistics.

Ramsay is providing financial support (\$10,000 per annum) to supplement funds raised by Rotary Berrima to meet overseas transport costs.



The Ramsay & Rotary medical equipment donation program started in December 2010 with the donation of hospital beds, consumables and other essential items to hospitals in Fiji. The deliveries to Fiji were the first of its kind for the program.

- consumables
