The Translational Challenge Grant (TCG) is the flagship program of the Ramsay Hospital Research Foundation, driving research that tackles the root causes of health inequality. By funding projects that explore the impact of education, socioeconomic status, lifestyle factors and environment, the TCG aims to break the cycle of disadvantage and create lasting improvements in patient outcomes.

A maximum of \$400,000 is available per project.

# Long Term Effectiveness of Ketamine Treatment on TRD



A new publication from <u>The CARE Network</u>, an RHRF funded study, has been published in the Journal of Affective Disorders and is the first study of its kind, outlining the real-world clinical data on the long-term effectiveness and safety of generic racemic ketamine treatment for people with Treatment Resistant Depression (TRD).

"Findings suggested that racemic ketamine, when appropriately dosed and administered within a structured clinical and safety monitoring framework, is both effective, safe and well-tolerated over a 6-month treatment period."- Clara Massaneda-Tunea, 2025

The Care Network, is a collaborative network of clinicians and researchers, established to promote best quality clinical care in Neurostimulation and Interventional Psychiatry. The paper is authored by a team from Ramsay Clinic Northside including: Clara Massaneda-Tuneu, Colleen Loo, Donel Martin, Dalia Moreno,

Justine Ellis, Owen Samuels, Ian Fowler, Michael Bull, Ana Rita Barreiros, Louise Brettell and Philip Mitchell, as well as others from UNSW, Black Dog Institute, Sydney University, and The George Institute for Global Health.



# **EPIK project secures additional NHMRC funding**

EPIK is a registry nested trial, led by Professor Sam Adie looking into pain management after Total Knee Replacement. The study was awarded initial funding from RHRF in the 2023-2024 TCG grant round, and has undertaken 3 co-designed workshops to determine a final model of care.

The study has since secured additional funding from NHMRC through their Clinical Trials and Cohort Studies Grant where they have been awarded \$2,154,577.23


